One of our innovations includes a 14-foot-tall hand-pump lifter we designed and manufactured for Design Outreach. The digital scale pictured here measured in excess of one ton with no signs of stress. This is more than enough pulling power to extract riser pipes from the ground. What formerly required a full work crew can now be handled by just a couple of people and is much safer to perform.

In 2022...



We assisted 117 ministries in 50 countries with everything from equipment and service to consultation and training.



368 SonSetLink[®] monitoring units encompassing 8 different models were shipped to 14 countries.



We delivered 12 Solar Ministry Toolkits to 6 ministry partners in 5 countries.



22 portable power protection units were delivered to 9 ministries in 9 countries.



We shipped 9,615 SonSet[®] radios to 21 ministry locations in 16 countries.



9 transmitters and 12 broadcast antennas were sent to radio partners, and 4 new radio stations were established.

Mike Tapia, our Power Solutions Team leader, traveled to Uganda, Tanzania and the Dominican Republic to install Solar Ministry Toolkits for eight churches and to train nationals to perform future installations. Clinics, schools, churches and other ministries located in isolated regions benefit greatly from our solutions. The Solar Ministry Toolkit provides ministry-enhancing tools for evangelism, church planting, and discipleship.

Reaching the Isolated

Situated on a small plot of land between two mosques, a small church in rural Uganda reaches out to the neighborhood via an audio production they call “Hope in the Word of God.” This is produced using a simple microphone and played over outdoor speakers. One morning, a Muslim woman came to the church. She wanted to confess Christ as her Lord and Savior. She heard the early morning messages on the speakers, and the Holy Spirit touched her heart.

Pastor Ronald is intentional about reaching his community with the love of Christ. A cell phone charging station and media device loaded with Christian content are also provided for the community.

These are just some of the ministry-enhancing tools included with our Solar Ministry Toolkit, a solar-powered system designed for locations where electricity is either nonexistent or unreliable. This reminds us how people in isolated places may be hard to reach, but they are not beyond the reach of God. 



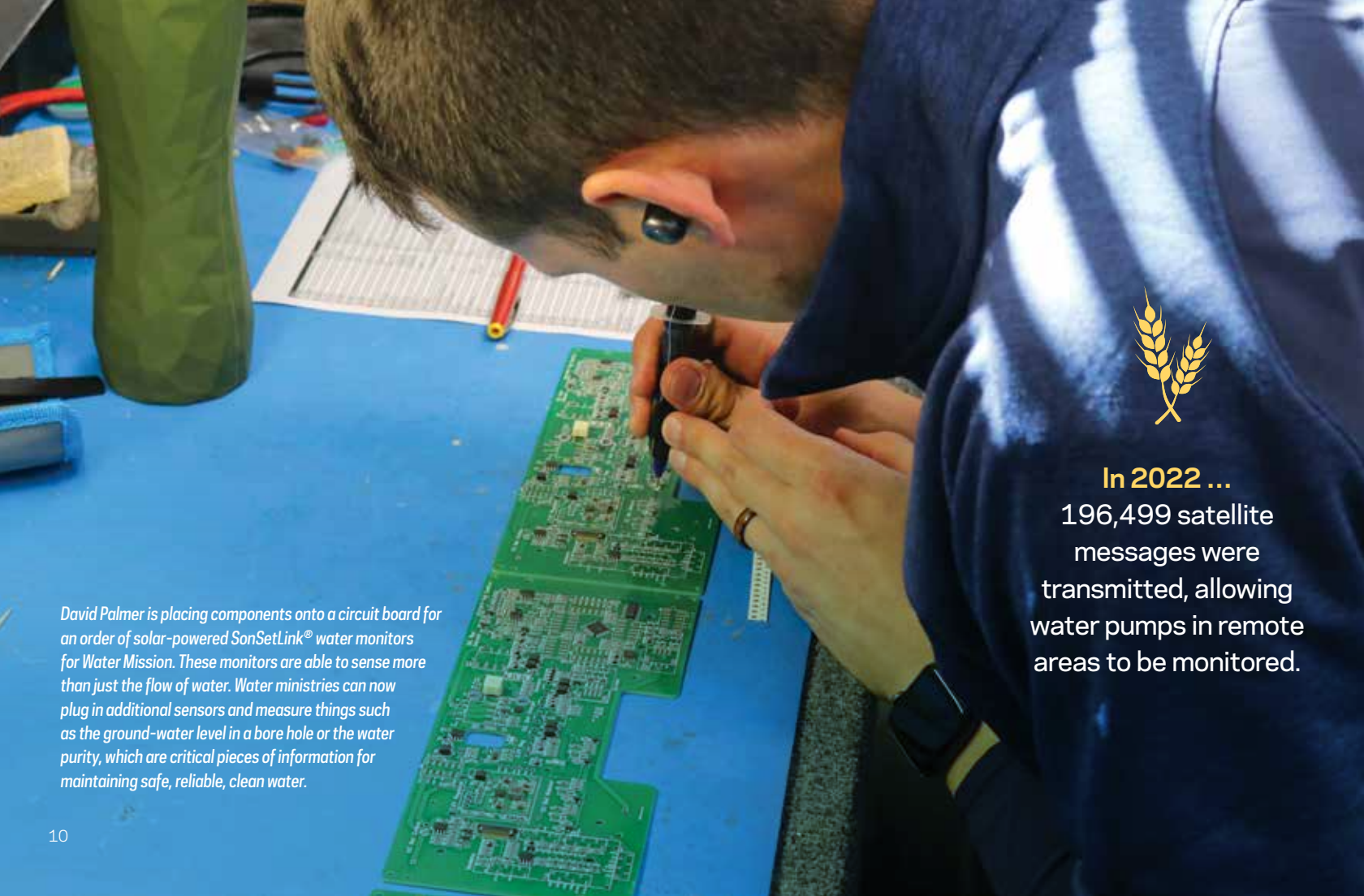
Over half of the refugees in the Kakuma refugee camp are under the age of 18. Children are able to attend primary and secondary schools located in and around the camp. "Desks" are crammed with children, and any latecomers must sit on the floor.

Reaching the Afflicted

Over 35 years ago, civil war in Sudan drove an estimated 20,000 young boys from their families and villages to escape death or conscription into the army. Most of these boys were just six or seven years old and walked more than a thousand miles before reaching the Kakuma refugee camp in Kenya. Half of them died along the way. The survivors became known as the “Lost Boys of Sudan.”

Although Kakuma means “nowhere” in Swahili, over the years, it has become home for more than 190,000 refugees from 19 countries. Last year, 2,800 SonSet® radios were distributed to refugees so they can hear gospel programming from our partner station which broadcasts into the camp. These displaced people are now hearing messages that provide hope in spite of their affliction.

“Thanks for your strong effort for these refugees,” writes our ministry partner. “We are so pleased that many can now hear the Gospel on Kakuma FM.”

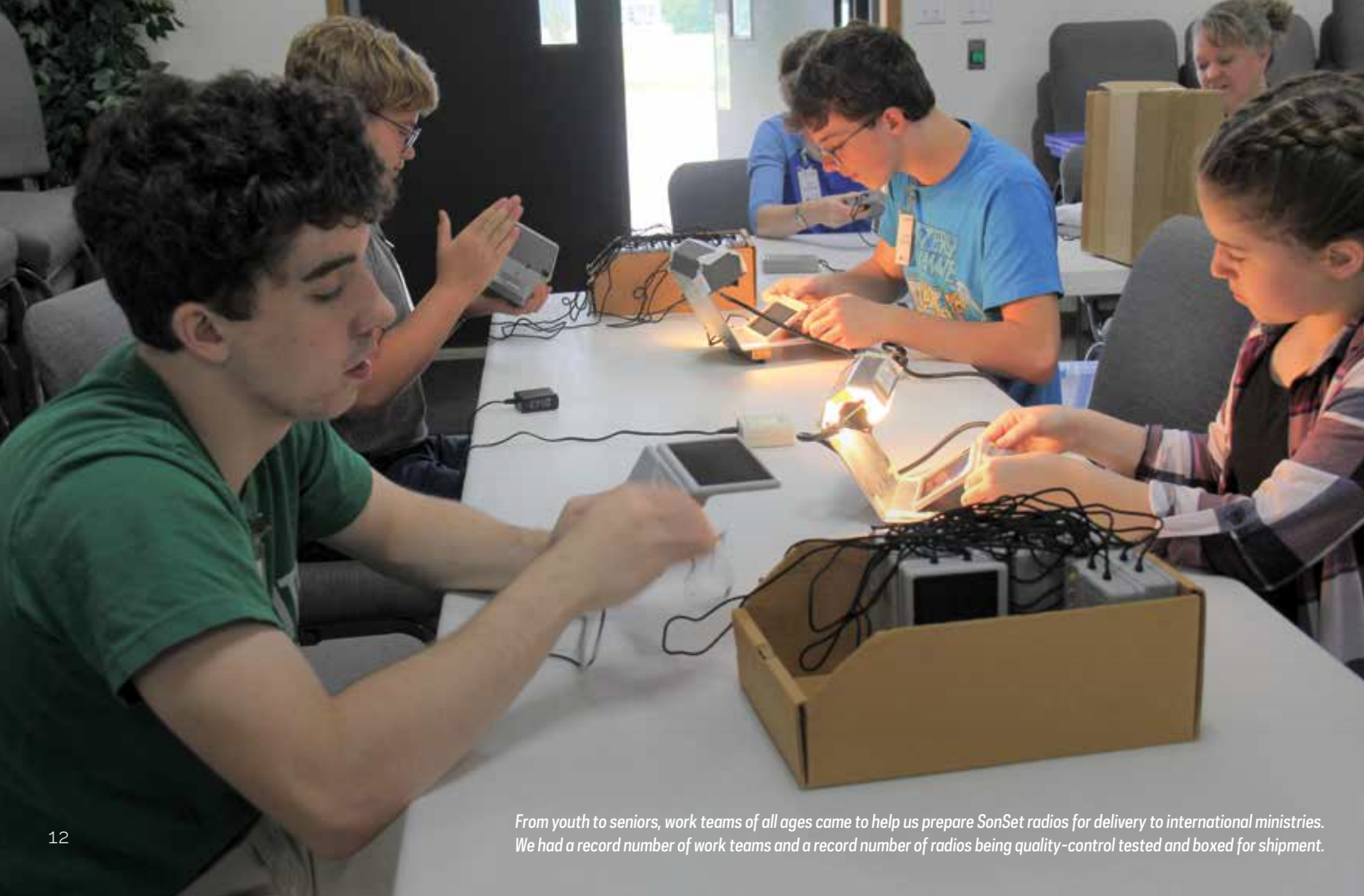
David Palmer is placing components onto a circuit board for an order of solar-powered SonSetLink® water monitors for Water Mission. These monitors are able to sense more than just the flow of water. Water ministries can now plug in additional sensors and measure things such as the ground-water level in a bore hole or the water purity, which are critical pieces of information for maintaining safe, reliable, clean water.

Reaching the Thirsty

Imagine that, where you live, the only thing holding you back from clean drinking water is a two-inch, AA lithium battery. Without it, you are uncertain if your water source is safe. But, where you live, acquiring batteries is expensive, or perhaps impossible.

Historically, SonSetLink®, which monitors the health and performance of clean water systems in remote areas, used AA, non-rechargeable lithium batteries. They served well because of our units' design and low power consumption; however, water ministries are also seeing the need to measure and report on the purity of the water. This requires more energy. It was clear we needed to make SonSetLink solar-powered.

Now, ministries can make fewer visits and experience lower costs when maintaining these systems, and our SonSetLink is more sustainable over the long haul. This is one way we help ministries provide reliable water and the trust to share the living water for those who are thirsty. 



From youth to seniors, work teams of all ages came to help us prepare SonSet radios for delivery to international ministries. We had a record number of work teams and a record number of radios being quality-control tested and boxed for shipment.

In 2022...



14 churches raised \$32,261 for 706 SonSet radios and 4 Solar Ministry Toolkits.



27 work teams came to prepare 12,000 SonSet radios for shipment.



We gained 8 new global ministry partners.



7 staff members traveled to assist ministries in 7 locations around the world.



15 staff members participated in 16 on-campus college mission conferences and career fairs.



2 missionary appointees, 2 short-term missionaries, and 2 volunteers began service with us.

Having our own machine shop enables us to design, create and test different versions of equipment for a variety of needs as well as fulfill unique requests. This includes the creation of a handle upgrade to address India Mark II pump failures. This will improve the longevity of the most common hand pump in the world.

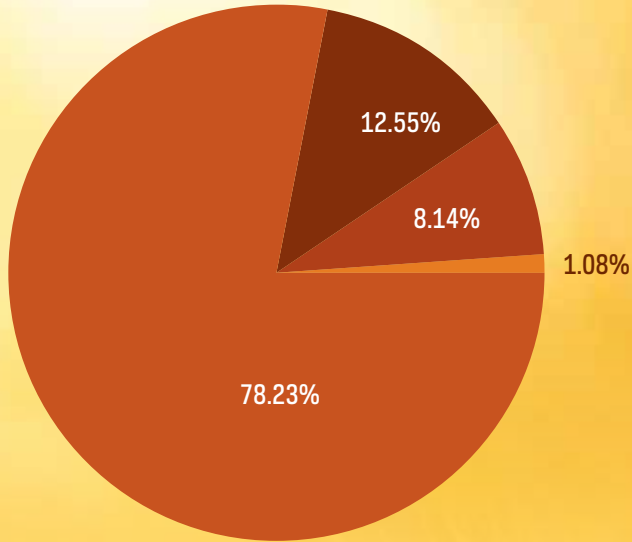

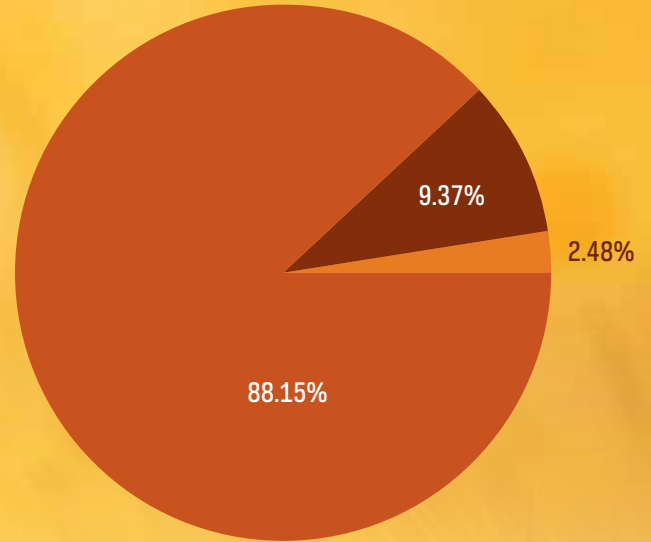
